Course Description:

This course begins with the European Renaissance and proceeds through to Modern times.

Students will learn about advancements in science and thought during the Age of Enlightenment and the social and political revolutions that followed as a result. As students meander through the 19th century, they will learn about the transformation from an agricultural to an industrial world and the many changes that resulted from that shift. Students will then learn about the interconnectedness of nationalism and colonialism and the two massive world wars were the end result. As students approach the finish line, they will learn about development in our modern world and the implications that historical events have on us today.

Course Assessment and Participation Requirements:

To achieve success, students are expected to submit work in each course weekly.
